we came upon it in the fields of Jaar:

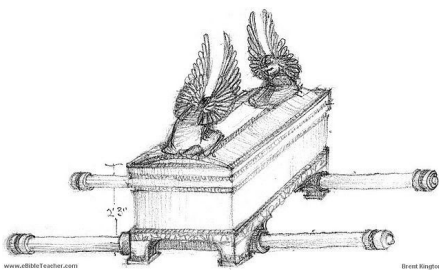
⁷ 'Let us go to his dwelling-place,

may your faithful people sing for joy."

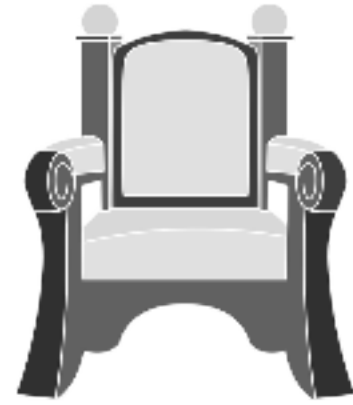
¹⁰ For the sake of your servant David,
